#### **May Book Ideas**

Refer to the <u>TeachingBooks Literary Calendar</u> for curricular connections and birthday and holiday celebrations.

Grades	Title	Themes Pos	Possibilities or Choose Your Own
PreK-2	The Patchwork Bike by Maxine Beneba Clarke and Van Thanh Rudd	Picture Book   Realistic Fiction   Bicycles	<ul> <li>Celebrate Bicycle Month by introducing Maxine Beneba Clarke, author of The Patchwork Bike.</li> <li>Watch the complete book reading with your class.</li> <li>Use the Cultural Representation Reflection, allowing your students to draw a comparison of their lives to the book's characters. You can also do it as a class.</li> <li>Ask students to create their own collage item, as described in the teachers' guide from Candlewick Press.</li> </ul>
	Drawn Together by Minh Lê and Dan Santat  Tagetter	Picture Book   Graphic Novel   Asian American	<ul> <li>Before you share the book, use the "Teacher's Tool For Navigation" activity in the teaching ideas from Unleashing Readers. Talk about how they were able to communicate without words.</li> <li>Introduce the author and illustrator of Drawn Together by playing their Audio Name Pronunciations.</li> <li>Read aloud or play the complete book reading of Drawn Together—be sure you watch to the end for a secret about the book's design.</li> <li>Listen to the Meet-the-Author Recordings for behind-the-scenes scoop. Then utilize the Disney-Hyperion discussion guide for questions and follow-up activities.</li> </ul>
1-5	FAUIA SINGH Keeps Going by Simran Jeet Singh and Baljinder Kaur	Picture Book   South Asian   Sports Biography	<ul> <li>Celebrate National Sports Month by learning about Fauja Singh. Follow the pre-reading activities in the educator's guide from Penguin Classroom.</li> <li>Show the complete book reading, read by the author.</li> <li>Play the Meet-the-Author Recording with Simran Jeet Singh.</li> <li>Refer back to the educator's guide for post-reading discussion and activities.</li> </ul>

Grades	Title	Themes	Possibilities or Choose Your Own
1-5	Carmela Full of Wishes by Matt de la Peña and Christian Robinson  *Also available in Spanish	Picture Book   Latino/African   Emotions	<ul> <li>Meet the award-winning team of Carmela Full of Wishes by watching the interview with Matt de la Peña by Brightly.</li> <li>Play the audiobook excerpt and invite readers to draw what they heard.</li> <li>Read the book or show the complete book reading. Encourage your class to compare what they saw in the book to what their classmates drew.</li> <li>If time allows, complete the paper bracelet craft in the craft activity from MaiStoryBook or use the Share Tool to send it home to parents.</li> </ul>
4-8	Roller Girl by Victoria Jamieson	Realistic Fiction  Graphic Novel   Sports	<ul> <li>It's National Sports Month. Use the <u>Hands-free Book Browsing Collection</u> to demonstrate how to listen to an audiobook excerpt and read a Google Preview to make appropriate reading selections with a sports theme.</li> <li>Select Filters: Grade 4-8 and Genre Sports. Sort by Reading Level. To save your filters, right-click on <i>Roller Girl</i> to open in a new window.</li> <li>Play the <u>audiobook excerpt</u>, then read from the <u>Google Preview</u>.</li> <li>Allow your class to practice using the <u>Hands-free Book Browsing Collection</u> to find their next, just-right book.</li> </ul>
	The Nest by Kenneth Oppel and Jon Klassen	Science Fiction/Fantasy   Chapter Book   Disability	<ul> <li>Launch Canadian's Children's Book Week by sharing the book trailer of Kenneth Oppel's The Nest. Show the awards it has won on the book page.</li> <li>Play the Meet-the-Author Recording for The Nest.</li> <li>Share the audiobook excerpt. Tell students that they have listened to three ways to preview a book. Ask them how these resources hook them to read the book.</li> <li>Ask readers to write/talk about questions they have about the story. Refer to the reading group guide from Simon &amp; Schuster, as needed.</li> </ul>

#### **May Author Study Ideas**

Ed Young: Author Study	PreK-2	<ul> <li>Introduce author/illustrator Ed Young by playing his <u>Audio Name Pronunciation</u>.</li> <li>Show the cover of <i>Seven Blind Mice</i>, then play the <u>audiobook excerpt</u>. Ask the students how blind mice can "see" what's at the pond.</li> <li>Watch the video <u>book reading</u>. What do the students think the mice have found? Read the book aloud if you have access to a copy.</li> <li>Use the "What Am I?" Activity to have your class write riddles as guided in the <u>lesson plan</u> from Weston Woods.</li> </ul>
	1-5	<ul> <li>Learn about Ed Young by watching the Meet-the-Author Movie.</li> <li>Ask students to write three things they learned about him from watching the movie.</li> <li>Show your class how to browse books by Ed Young. Narrow your choices by filtering for Grades 1-5. How many books do they see now?</li> <li>Visit your library catalog. How many of these titles does your library own? Read from a selection of your options. Or, locate and listen to excerpts by filtering the book results for Ed Young page for Read-Along Performances.</li> </ul>
	4-8	<ul> <li>Show students how to search for the author, <u>Ed Young</u>. Talk about the featured items in red text at the top of the page—resources, awards, and books.</li> <li>Listen to the <u>audiobook excerpt</u> from <i>Lon Po Po</i>. Ask: What do they know about the story?</li> <li>Play the <u>Meet-the-Author Recording</u> for <i>Lon Po Po</i>. Be sure to show them the illustration to which he refers. Ask: What do they know now about the story that they didn't know before?</li> </ul>
